Internet Evidence - Locating evidence related to online social media services can be problematic for the untrained and new technologies are being refined daily to retrieve artifacts from sources such as Facebook, MSN, Yahoo, and Google web services. FDD is familiar with techniques to recover transient page and chat artifacts. Employers should ensure that Employees have read the posted policies relevant to Internet use and allow Employees to ask questions about these policies and their scope.



Mobile device forensics – due to the popularity of mobile phones, PDAs, and Internet-capable portable gaming systems there is a growing need for mobile device forensic analyses. FDD can image and analyze most mobile devices and associated storage media and explain how it might be useful to an overall investigation. Employers should be aware that the scope of investigation extends only to phones the company pays for and the acceptable use policy should clearly state that mobile devices paid for by the company are subject to examination periodically.

Forensic Accounting – in the shadow of this downturn economy there has been a noticeable increase in financial crimes and many of those involve digital devices in some way. Document tampering, fraud, embezzlement, and creative accounting cost businesses more than 180 million dollars last year – FDD has experience tracking these events to their sources and may be able to provide you with the valuable insight you need to understand these events.

Policy development – Ensuring your policy of acceptable use is enforceable and complete can be difficult depending on the types of technologies your company utilizes. FDD can help you to understand your limitations and construct a document that protects your vital business assets.

Technical and Expert Witness Testimony – Examiners can be called upon to review evidence collected by law enforcement or private agencies. There is an unfounded belief that locating files on a hard disk is sufficient evidence that a crime has been committed. Due to the multitude of ways data can be created and modified it is of critical importance that you account for that data and understand any and all ways that data may have arrived at its destination. Examiners can be retained to provide technical and expert witness testimony during the preliminary hearing, pre-trial, and case-in-chief as needed.

Information Recovery – The loss of important documents plagues businesses and in many circumstances FDD is capable of recovering these files and directories. Local file recovery is generally less expensive than shipping your hard disks out for IR services.
